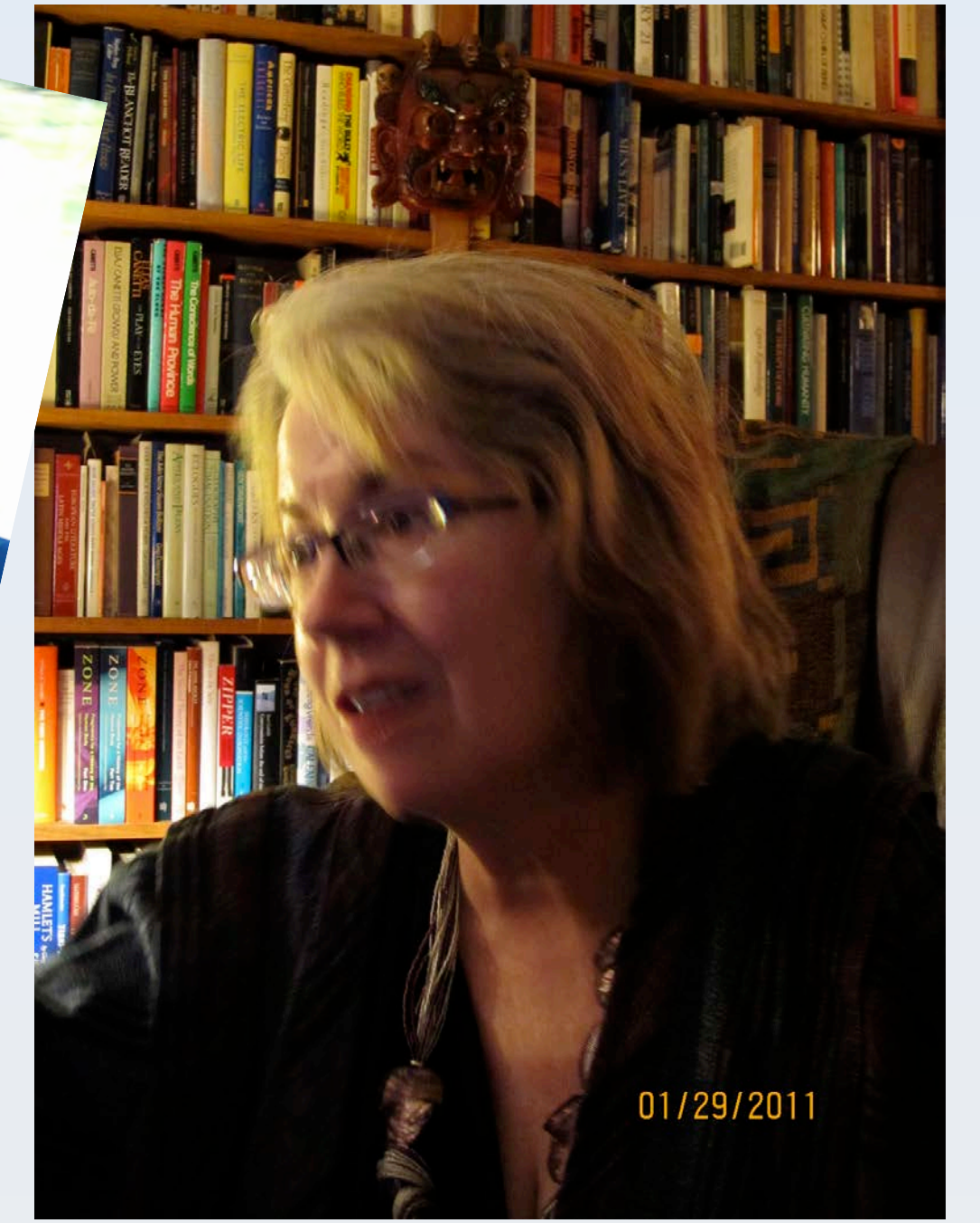

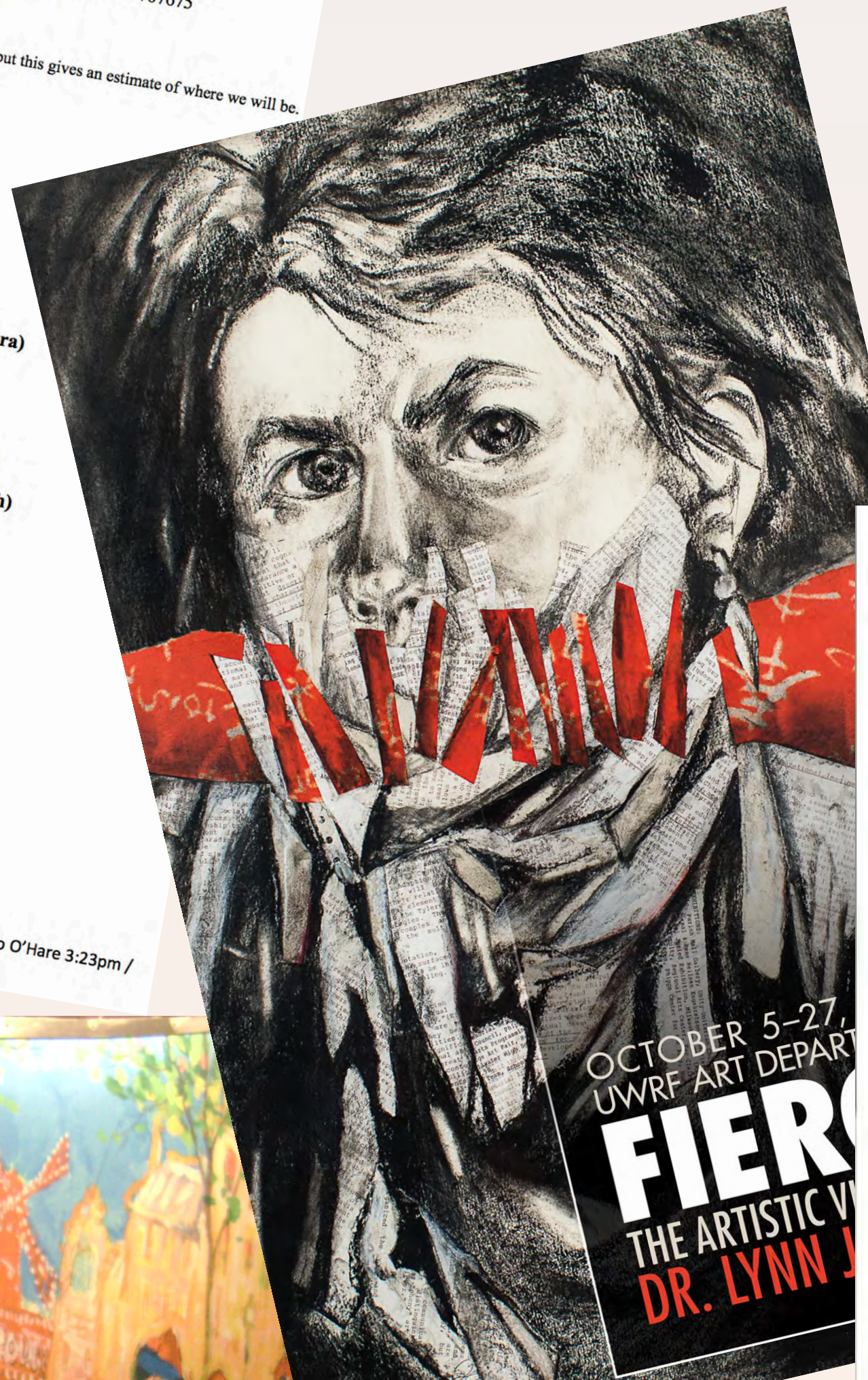


## Artist Statement

I am also involved in orchestrating collaborative art projects with both artists and community members. Facilitating deep collaboration through the creative process enriches personal creativity and confidence in others while challenging me to produce new work. My teaching reflects a community-based orientation that not only embraces the "humans" in the definition of community, but also the possibility for the experience of the arts to cultivate engagement and empathy. I strive to help art educators move toward curriculum and material choices that value and conserve our environment and respect a variety of cultures and art forms. I ascribe to Boyer's vision that the aim of education is both career preparation and enabling students to live lives of dignity and purpose (Creating the New American College, 1994).

## In Memory of Lynn Jermal



Dr. Lynn Marie Jermal, age 59 of Hudson, passed away May 22, 2012 at her residence surrounded by her family. Lynn was born January 7 1953 in Chicago, Illinois, the daughter of Richard and Rita (Wiley) Jermal. She attended St. Juliana elementary school and St. Scholastica High School in Chicago. After high school, Lynn attended the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana where she received a B.A. in Art. She received an M.A. in Interdisciplinary Arts from Concordia College and a PhD. From the University of Minnesota. Lynn was a professor of art and art education at the University Wisconsin-River Falls for 26 years. She was united in marriage to Kevin Caldwell on April 13, 2002 in the Newman Chapel at the University of Wisconsin River Falls.

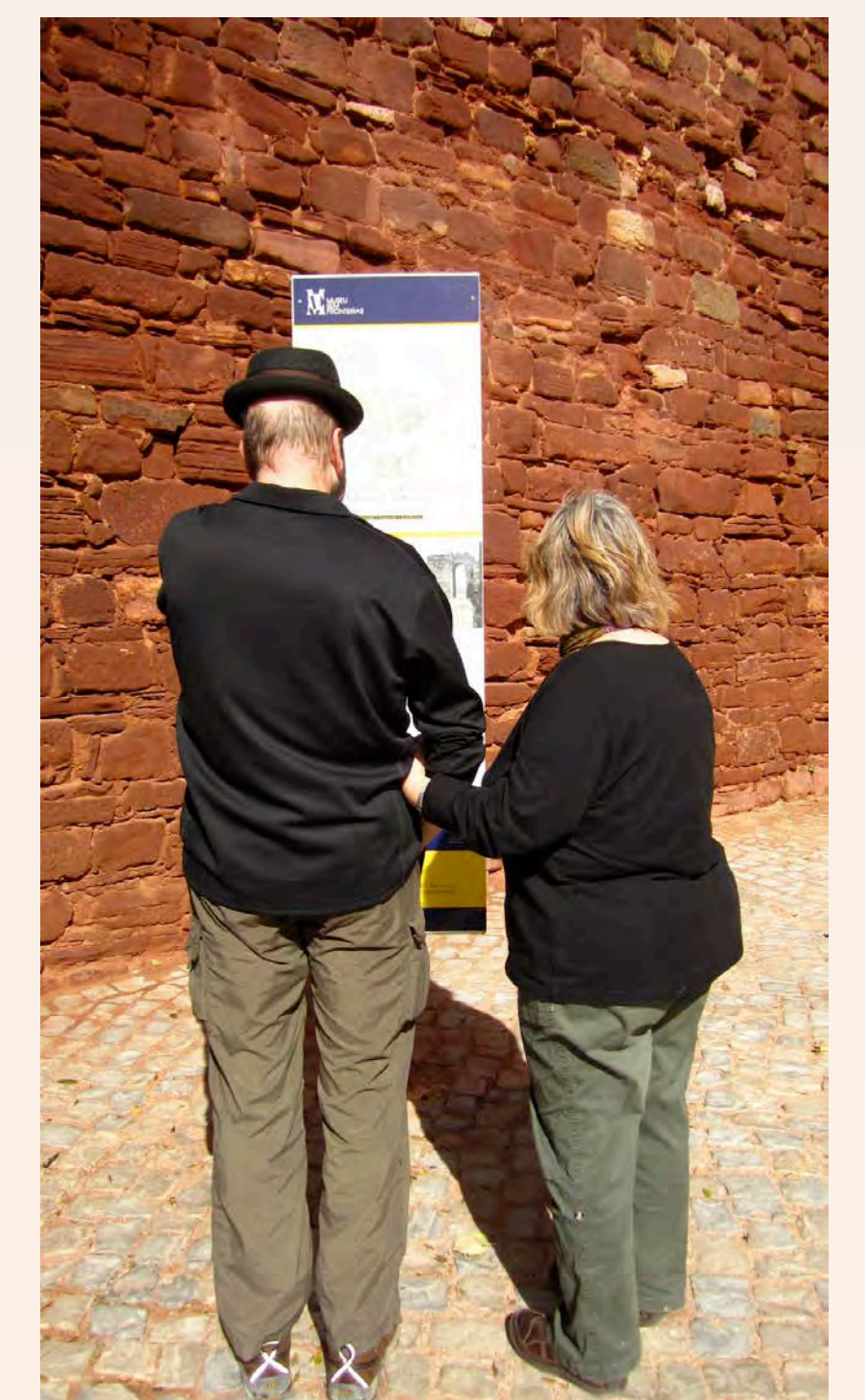
Lynn was a gifted studio artist who reveled in collaborative projects - there are many examples of her work with students and the greater community on the UWRP campus. She was an early and active artist member of the Women's Art Registry of Minnesota (WARM). She was especially interested in the creative process and had done much research into that throughout her academic career. It became the foundational centerpiece of the M.S.E. program she co-developed at UWRP. Her commitment to students

was total and at times unrelenting. She would do everything she could to make sure students had every chance to complete their program. She graded her last student paper less than a week before her passing. She was a tireless traveler, having taught twice in the Wisconsin in Scotland program, created the cultural conservation internship program in Yunnan province in China, and in the fall of 2010, she was the faculty supervisor the Study Abroad-Europe program mentoring 20 students spread throughout Europe. She was very social and enjoyed entertaining and cooking for others. No occasion was too insignificant for lots and lots of food and a houseful of guests. Lynn also had a green thumb and enjoyed gardening, and was especially proud of her hostas and irises. Lynn was gregarious in her spirit, but her final days were full of serenity.

Lynn will remain in the hearts of her husband, Kevin; sons, Zero Selon of Los Angeles, Daniel Selon of Los Angeles and Adam Selon of Washington; daughter-in-heart, Haiya Zhang of Washington D.C.; siblings, Richard (Jeanne) Jermal of Chicago and their family Tom (Shannon) Jermal of Chicago, Beth (Dan) Flores, Kathy (fiancé, Andrew); Robert Jermal and his family Rene, Christopher (fiancé, Abby Sturges); and also the many thousands of students she touched and inspired. She was preceded in death by her parents, Richard and Rita Jermal.

A Funeral Service for Lynn will take place 1:00 PM Saturday, May 26, 2012 at United Methodist Church of River Falls. Visitation will only be 5:00 -8:00 PM Friday, May 25, 2012 at the O'Connell Family Funeral Home, 520 S. 11<sup>th</sup> St., Hudson. Interment will take place at Willow River Cemetery in Hudson.

# Dr. Robert B. Bailey, III



The Semester Abroad: Europe program was initiated in 1963 by the late Robert B. Bailey, III. Dr. Bailey conceived of the Quarter Abroad program, as it was known then, as a special opportunity for University of Wisconsin-River Falls students to engage in experiential learning projects and independent travel in Europe.



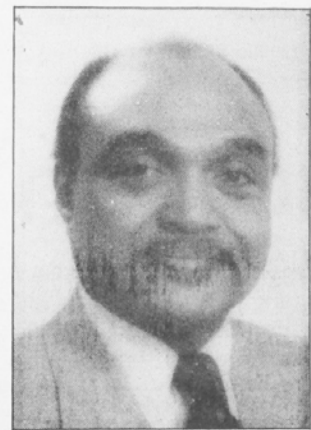
## "Outstanding professor" at UW-RF dies

Dr. Robert B. "Doc" Bailey III, the first black professor at UW-River Falls, died June 4. A memorial service was held June 15 at Albert Concert Hall in the Fine Arts building.

Dr. Bailey, who was 63 at the time of his death, retired in May 1991 after 35 years of teaching sociology at UW-RF.

A native of Roanoke, Va., Dr. Bailey, who was chairman of the school's sociology department for 20 years, inaugurated the school's Semester Abroad Program, a program that sent students to Europe, Asia and Africa to conduct research. Nearly 800 students have participated in the program.

He received his bachelor's degree from Talladega College in Talladega, Ala., and a Fulbright Scholarship at Birmingham University in Birmingham, England. He also studied at the universities of Munich and Frankfurt before receiving his doctorate at the University of Utrecht in the Netherlands.



ROBERT BAILEY III which required students to go to was Human Relations in the City the Twin Cities and observe life. For many students, Bailey was their first exposure to a black person. One student recalled Bailey as a "consummate professional, gracious and impressive."

Dr. Bailey wrote the book "Sociology Faces Pessimism" and also gave papers at numerous conferences, in addition to holding memberships in several sociological organizations.

In 1983, he was named outstanding professor at UW-RF, and he was social science teacher of the year there in 1985. In 1989, he was selected senior consultant to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities.

He was listed in American Men of Science, Community Leaders of America, Who's Who in Black America, Who's Who in Education and the International Who's Who in Community Service.

Survivors include his mother, Beatrice Bailey, 93, of Roanoke, Va.

Memorials may be made to the UW-RF Foundation for any of the three scholarships that Bailey created and nurtured: the Ernest A. Teves Scholarship, the River Falls Student Abroad Scholarship and the Robert B. Bailey III Scholarship.

Dr. Bailey did his undergraduate work at Talladega College in Alabama. In 1950 his sociology professor (and friend) suggested that he apply for a Fulbright scholarship. Bailey hesitated; he "was certain that the U.S. State Department of 1950-51 would not send [him], a southern black, to study overseas" (all quotations are from an article "The River Falls Experience: Custom-designing Study Abroad" that Dr. Bailey wrote for a CIEE publication, *Black Students and Overseas Programs*, 1991). He applied for and received a Fulbright scholarship to England in 1951-52. After studying in England for a year, he studied for three years at the Universities of Frankfurt and Munich, and then completed a Ph.D. in sociology at the University of Utrecht, the Netherlands.

Dr. Bailey came to the University of Wisconsin-River Falls (at that time Wisconsin State College) in 1957 as the university's first African American faculty member. He did not really believe he would stay long in River Falls, but in fact he was there until his retirement in 1991. At the time of Bailey's arrival, UW-River Falls was a fairly isolated institution: "a trip to Minneapolis-St. Paul, some 40 miles away, was a rare occasion for most. Certainly no study abroad program existed, nor was there any thought of developing one." In the summer of 1961, Bailey took a group of non UW-River Falls students to Germany. This group was from "an American socio-economic class with which [he] had not had previous contact," but they "represented the typical profile of American study abroad students in 1961 ... upper- or upper-middle class white women from professional families who had previously traveled abroad, and they had studied at least two years of a second language."

**1983 - Robert Bailey**

Dr. Robert Bailey, III, professor of sociology, was named the 1983 Distinguished Teacher. Bailey was chairman of the department of sociology and director of the Quarter Abroad Program at UW-River Falls. He joined the faculty in 1957.

Bailey originated the Quarter Abroad in 1963 and traveled to Europe 12 times with program participants. Semester Abroad is still one of few international study and travel programs in the U.S. offering undergraduates the opportunity to do independent research abroad.

Fluent in Dutch, French and German, Bailey was involved in international study activities throughout his career. He served on the UW-River Falls International Studies Committee since its inception in 1970.

Bailey was active with the Council on International Educational Exchange, headquartered in New York, and participants in Twin Cities International Programs for Social Workers and Youth Leaders at the University of Minnesota. He arranged family stays for the U.S. State Department International Visitors Program.

On a national level, Bailey was perceived to be visionary. His talents at including students from all walks of life and academic aspirations in international studies led several national groups to seek his counsel.



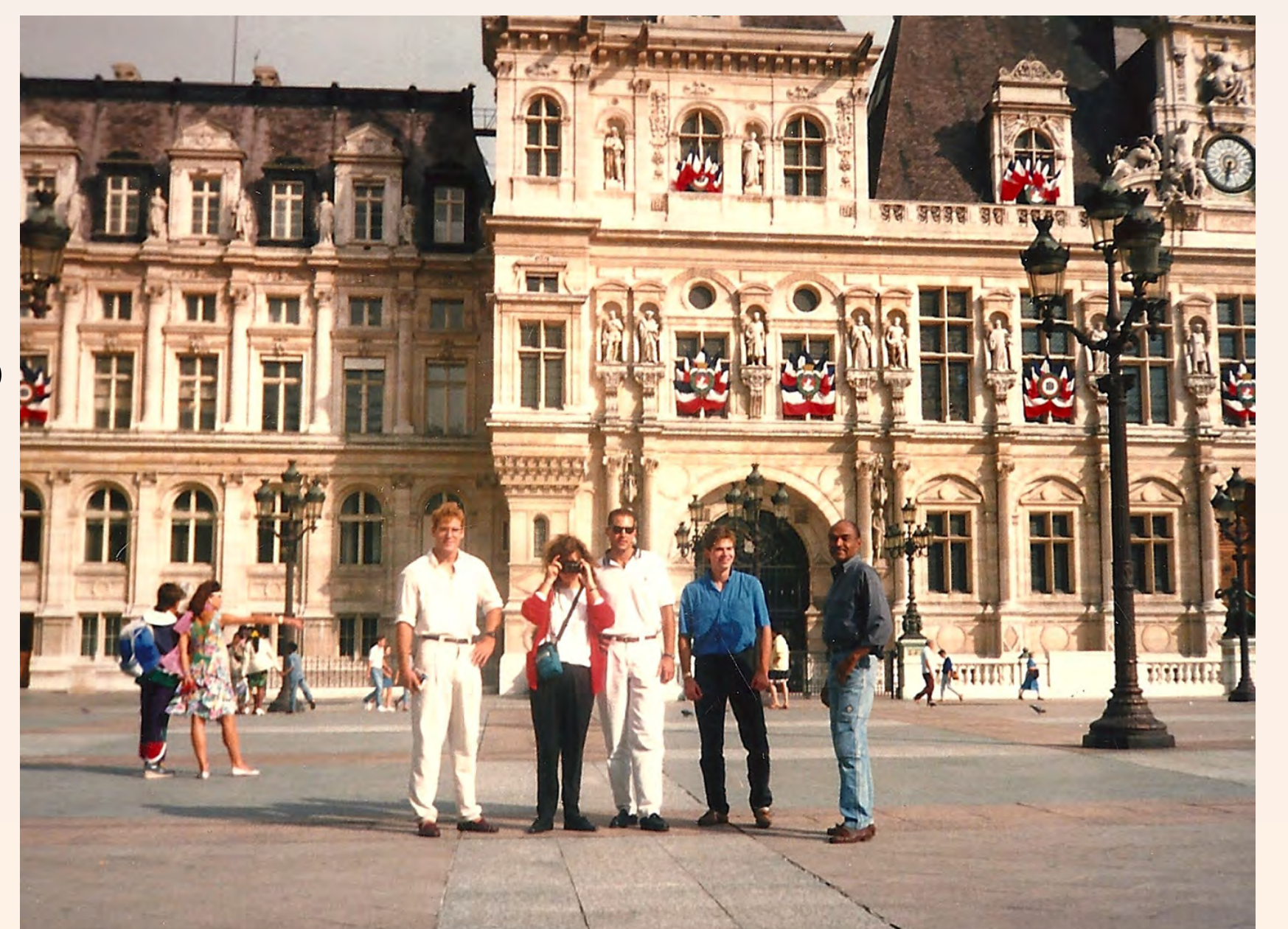
After this first trip abroad with university students, Bailey decided to establish an international program at UW-River Falls.

The profile of students at Wisconsin State College was quite different from those students I had led to Europe in 1961. The Wisconsin students were typically lower-middle class, from farm or non-professional families, who had not traveled outside of the Midwest and who had not studied a second language. However, they were also wholesome, unspoiled, diligent, possessed of great intellectual curiosity, and very excited at the prospect of going abroad.



The typical study abroad program at that time was the "Junior Year Abroad." Bailey considered the Columbia University-run Reid Hall in Paris to be an example of these elite programs. Former Semester Abroad program director Sandy Soares says she always understood exactly what Bailey was talking about. Coincidentally, she participated in a junior year abroad program in 1961, and she remarks that, as a west coast product of public schools, she felt very out of place among the upper-east-coast private school women.

Bailey consulted directors of programs at large universities about starting a program of his own at UW-River Falls, and they tried to discourage him. He was not, however, discouraged, and he began to develop a model for the student population at UW-River Falls. Since he felt that a year abroad would be beyond the means of most of the students, he created the **Quarter Abroad Program**.

## Foreign Student Assn. Hosts College European Tour Group

Foreign students hosted the group of students recently returned from the European tour and to their adviser, Dr. Robert Bailey of the sociology department.

The purpose of the meeting was to enable the adventurers to relate their experiences to the Foreign Student Assn.

Dr. Bailey began the discussion with a description of the trip and its significance and several students discussed their particular assignments in Europe.

Agricultural and economic research in Holland was the prime concern of Glenn Lee, senior from River Falls. The area which he surveyed surrounded the Suder Lake. Lee reported a delightful experience: German acquaintances, a bouquet of flowers in their hands, awaited him on the train platform to wish him a "Happy Birthday." American young men do not receive such gifts on their birthdays, he remarked. Yet his embarrassment quickly vanished when he realized the charm of the situation.

Dr. Bailey prepared a question sheet which the students used as a base in forming their opinions. Questions such as "was language a barrier?" and "were you shocked by the culture?" enabled students to have ideas what to think about.

In answer to the latter question, Pat Henneman replied that "shock" was experienced when the Europeans asked her about the American Indians and their conditions.

Tour students unanimously agreed that language was a barrier. They stressed remorse for not having studied the languages prior to the trip.

The students seemed overwhelmed by their experiences in Europe. "I wish I could go back right now" was a frequent comment.

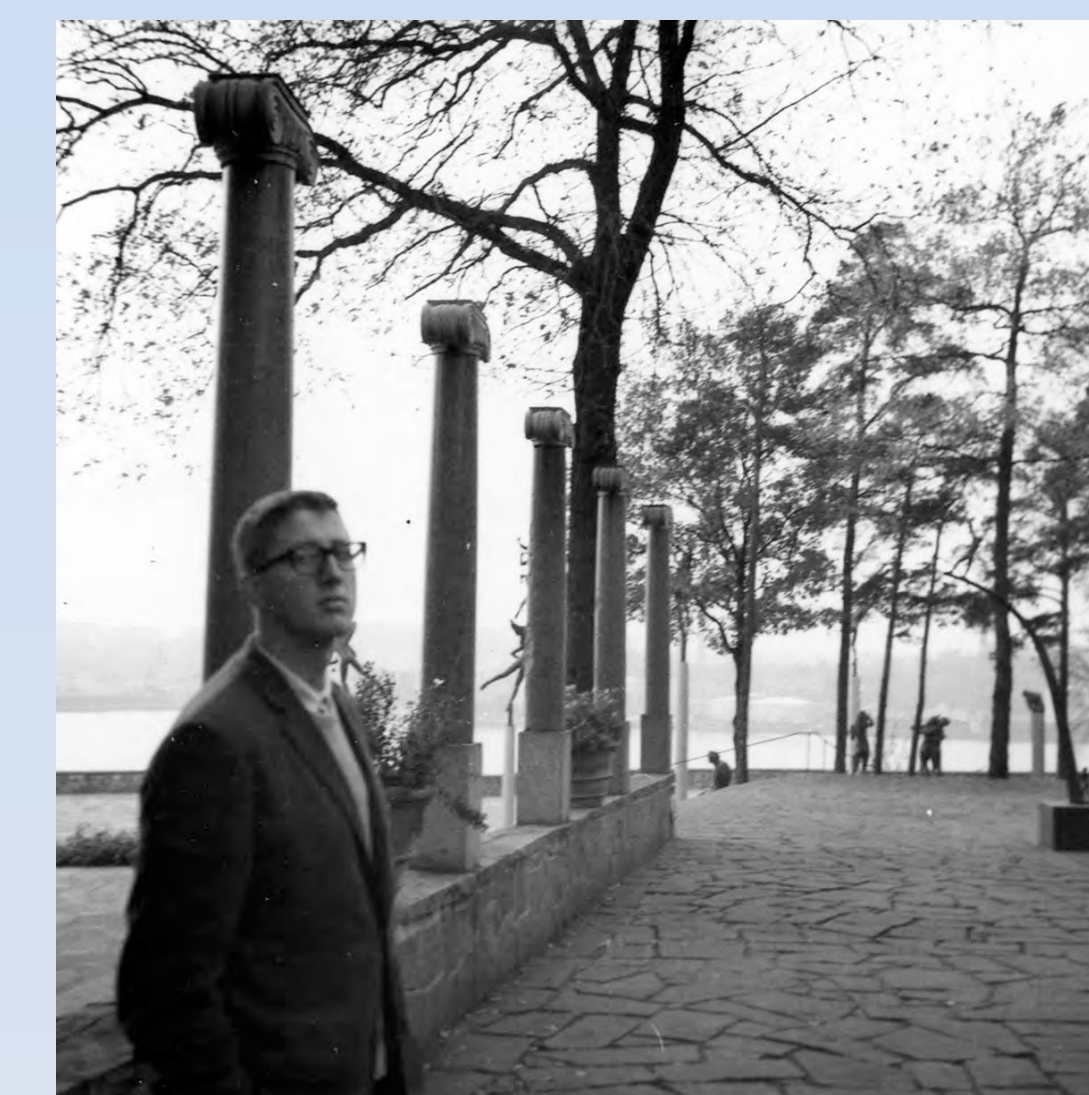

## RF Students Quarter Abroad Research Includes Politics, Police

(Editor's Note: Harvey Stower, senior from Grantsburg, is traveling in Sweden as a member of the quarter abroad program. He wrote this dispatch on Oct. 15.)

STOCKHOLM: (Special to the STUDENT VOICE). Eight students from the Wisconsin State University-River Falls Quarter Abroad program are presently in Stockholm. The students are engaged in projects in their major fields of study. The project entails background reading and similar preparation before coming to Sweden, interviews with persons in Sweden, the use of libraries in Stockholm and, in some cases, active "field" study. When the results of these activities are compiled, the Quarter Abroad student is expected to write a paper on his project. The paper is graded by a professor with whom the student is working in his major department.

In Sweden this autumn, River Falls students are doing the following studies:

Gary LaCrosse is studying the Stockholm police night patrol and its effectiveness in dealing with juvenile delinquency. He has spent a few evenings with the patrol, and was allowed to watch a closed-circuit telecast in the Stockholm central train station, where the police have cameras constantly scanning the crowds on the main floor, looking for law violators.

Dan Madison is also studying an aspect of Swedish juvenile delinquency. This past summer he studied the rate of recidivism (repeating offenses), and methods of treatment of delinquents at the St. Charles Training School for Boys, St. Charles, Illinois.

He will compare his findings from the St. Charles school with the information he received at a similar school in Stockholm. According to Gary LaCrosse, the teenagers who cause the most trouble here, are the "raggare", the black-leather jacket, reckless driving and "blackboard-jungle" individuals. Stockholm also has a good number of "mods," teenagers who let their hair grow shoulder-length (both male and female), and who dress in khaki US army combat jackets.

Jackie Lay is working with the director of a school for the deaf in Stockholm, studying the school's methods of teaching deaf children. She is doing her project for William Larsen of the RF speech department.

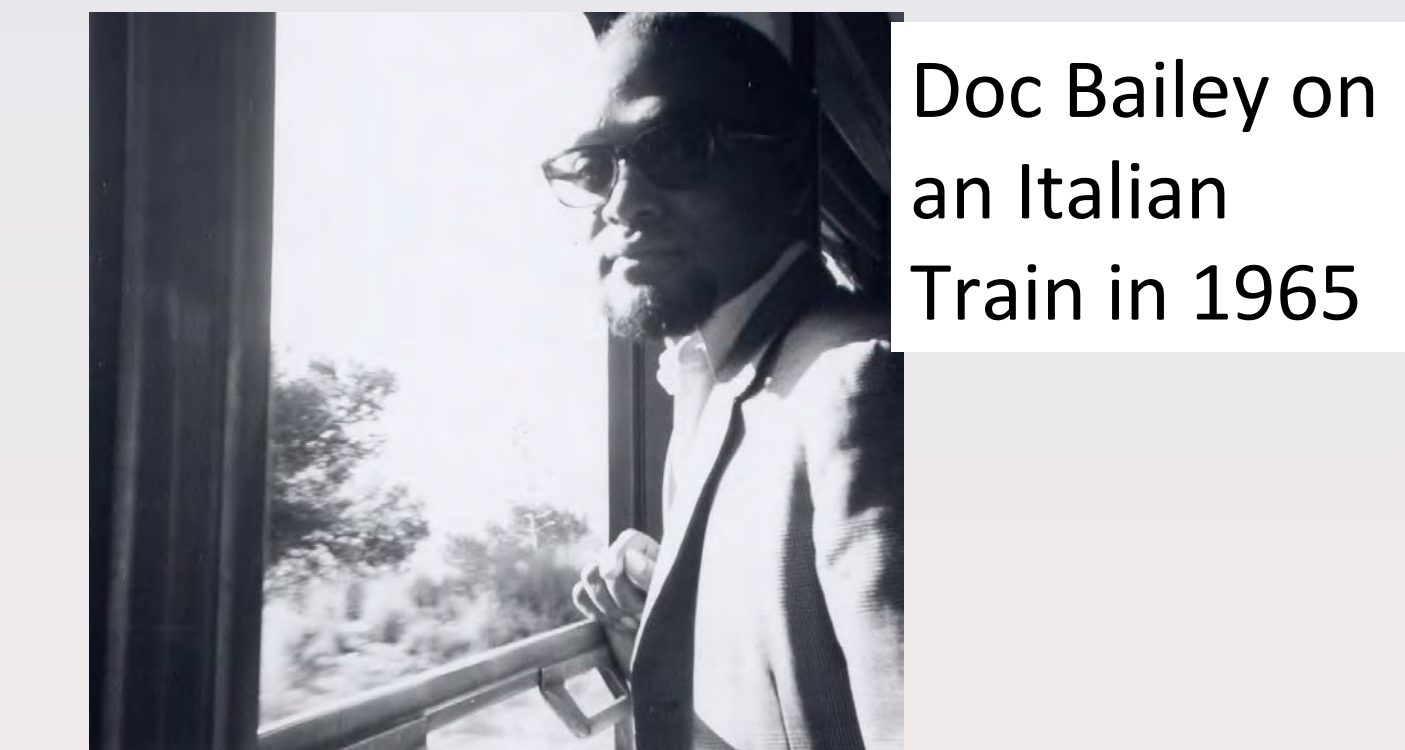

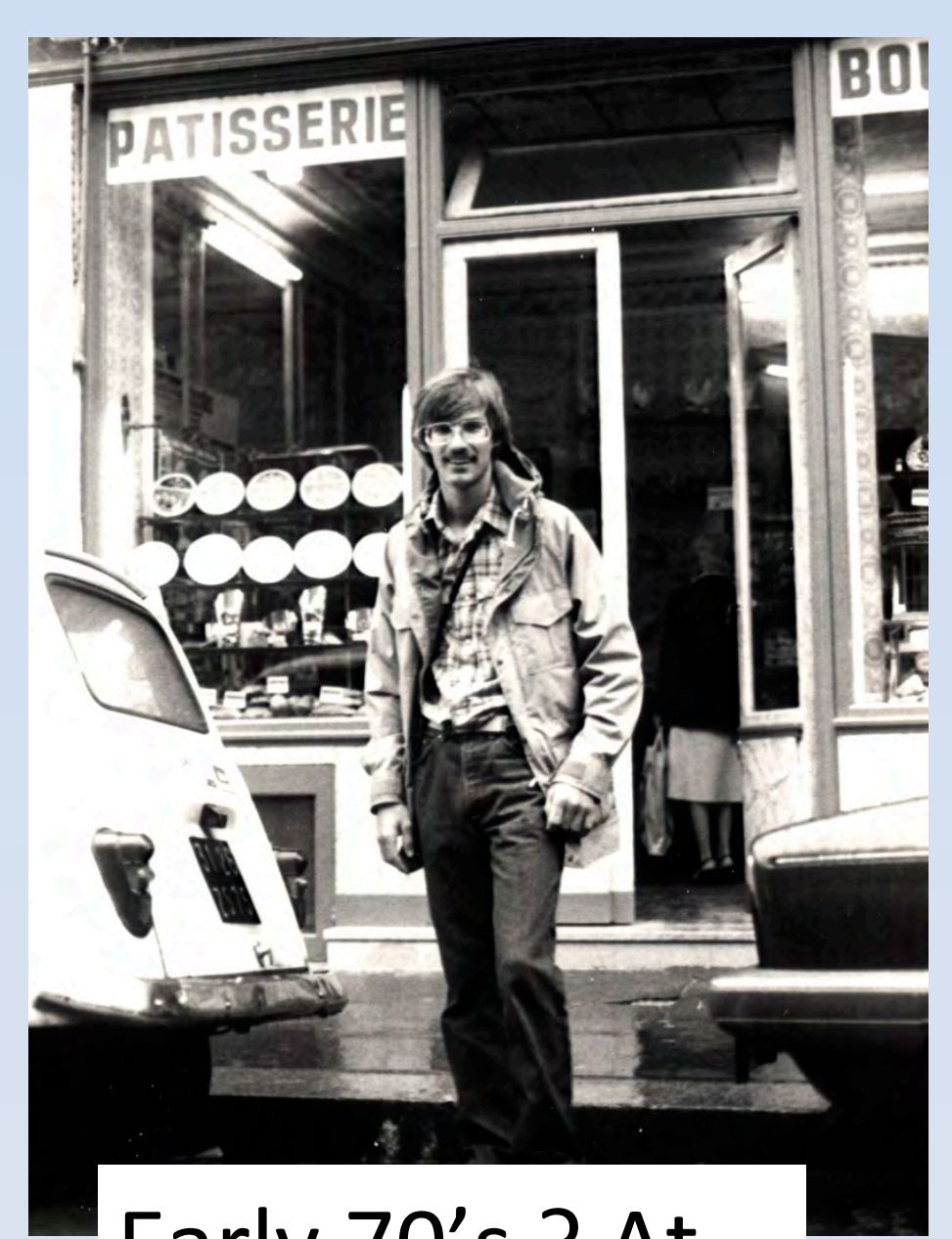

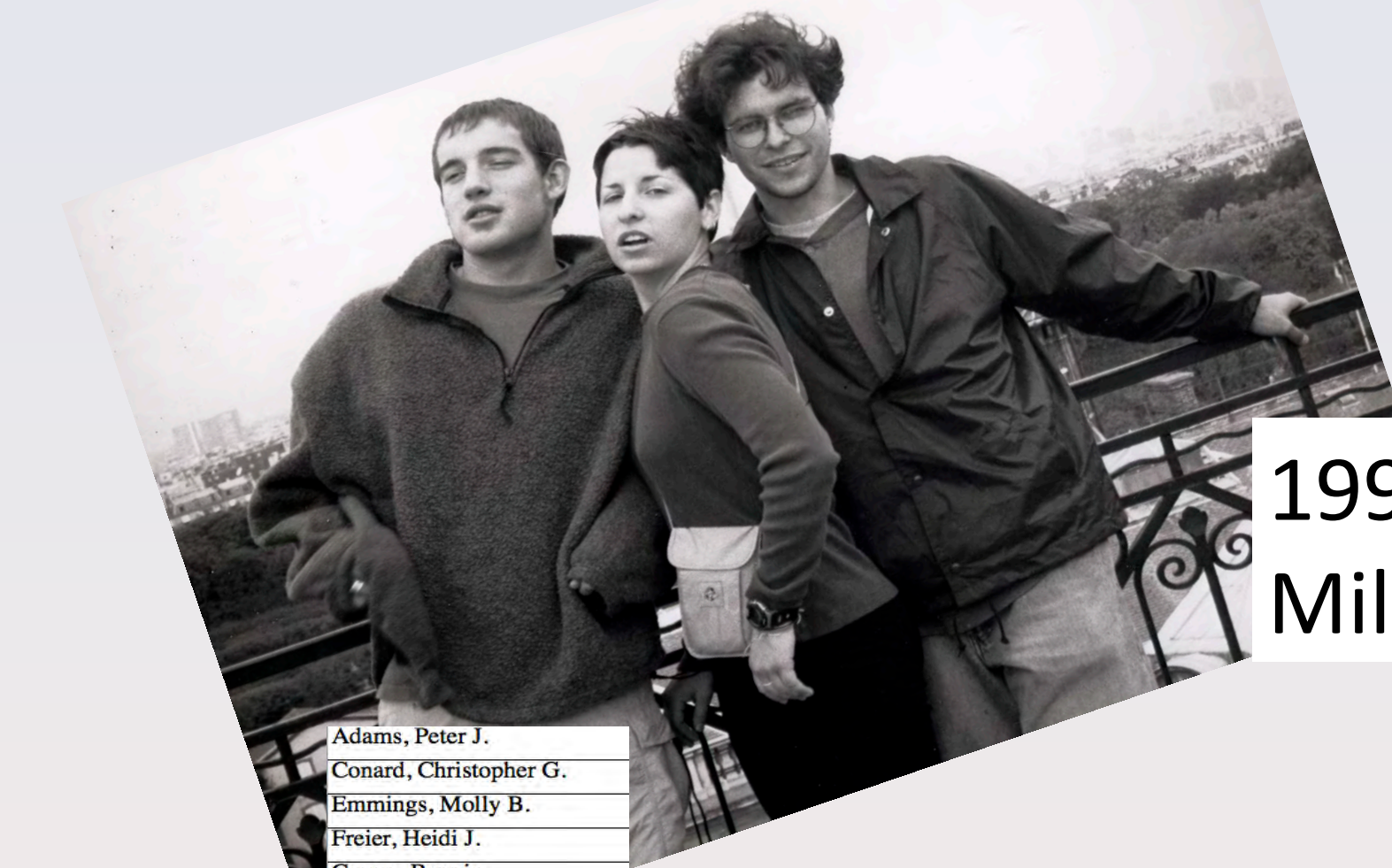

Many areas of study explored by students in Semester Abroad program

Researching the education and rehabilitation techniques of the hearing impaired in the Netherlands and the veterinary treatment of animals in Kenya were just two of the many areas explored by students enrolled in the 1990 Semester Abroad Study Program at UW-River Falls.  
Begun in 1983 by Dr. Robert Bailey, chairman of the UW-RF Sociology Dept., the program is designed to combine the most significant aspects of foreign travel and research with a meaningful educational experience.  
"Since switching over to the semester system last fall," Bailey said, "we gained a full month more to work with. We left on Sept. 1 and returned on Dec. 15."  
Bailey said the program has sponsored students of all ages, including mothers who have traveled with their children, as well as women over the age of 65. Some students have met their future spouses while journeying throughout Europe. One of the 1990 participants, Wendy Lee, met her girlfriend for the first time while traveling in England. Lee's mother was a student in the program in 1969. Bailey said, "There have been over 700 students in the program so far." Bailey said. "Each is required to do an extensive research project on any subject in their major. We meet once a week during spring semester to begin preparing for travel the following fall. I believe it is very important to be sensitive to the customs of other nations. I want the students to realize they will be foreigners and will have to adjust."  
Once the preparations are underway, each student must develop a research proposal with an academic advisor. The program offers 12 to 15 credits and costs approximately \$4,500 for tuition, travel, room and board.  
"We spend the first week abroad in Paris," Bailey said. "I don't really expect it to be too much of a problem." Bailey said. "We follow international guidelines and travel with care. We take certain precautions such as dressing interna-

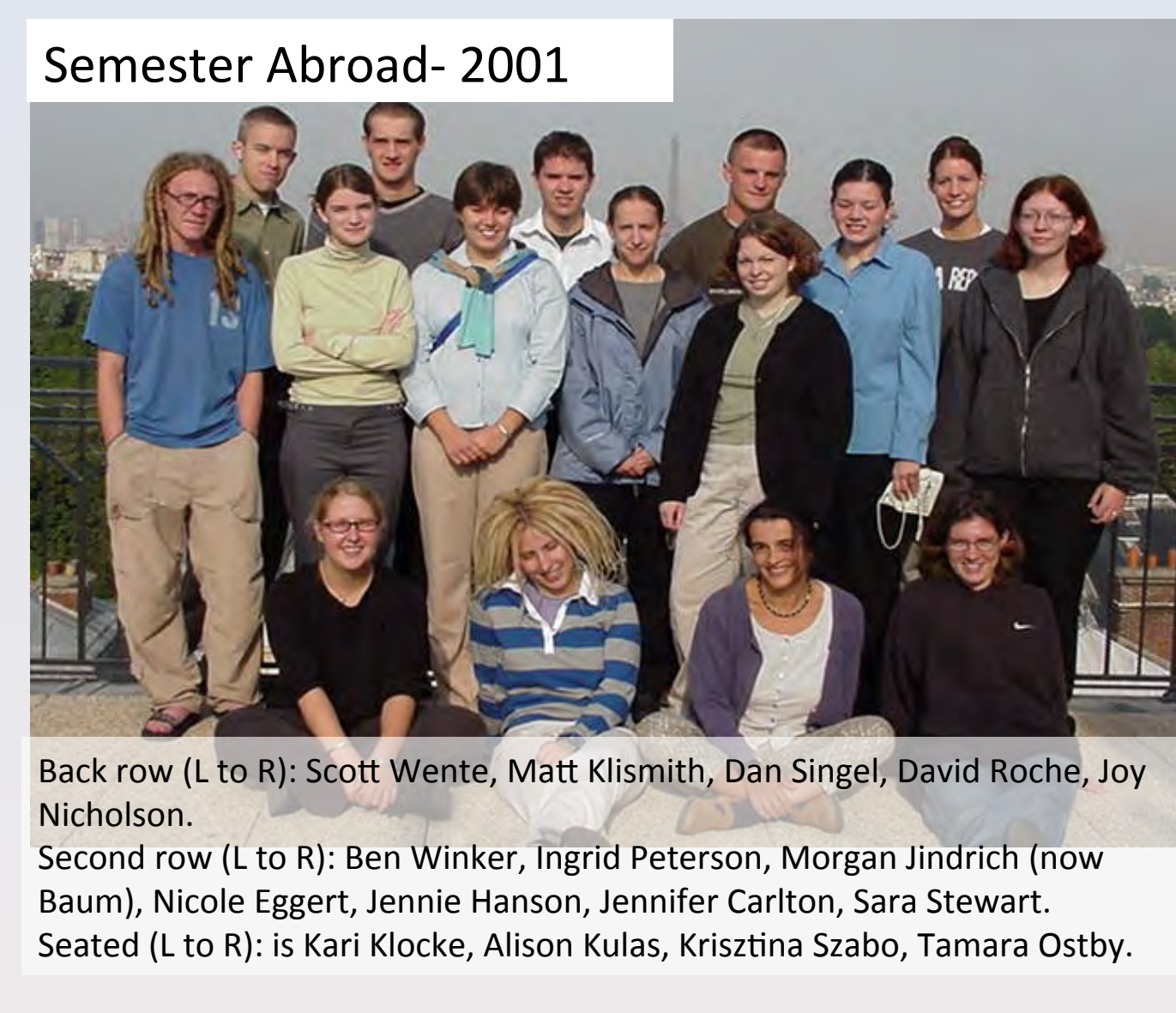
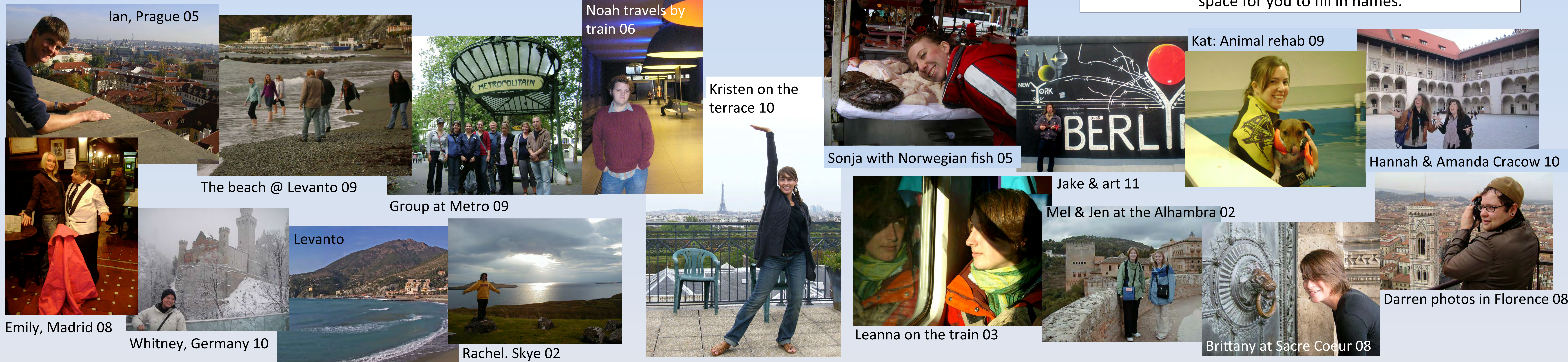

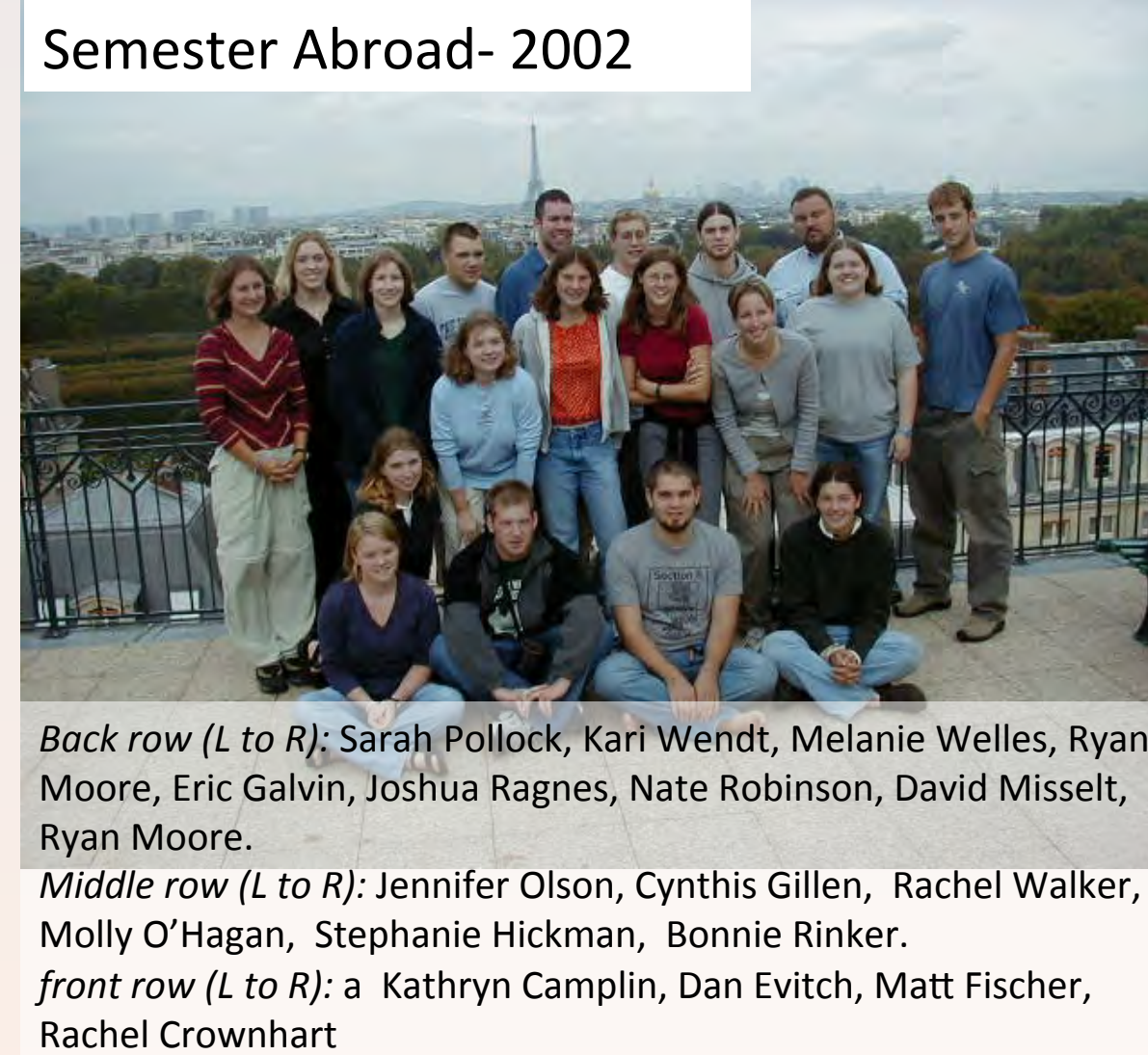
