

#### Carnival History

Twenty-five years ago the idea for a Winter Carnival was born. These first carnivals were sponsored by the Girls Athletic Association.

Back in 1927 the carnival was a one-day event. They had no king or queen for the feature attraction of the Carnival was a snowfight between the freshman and sophomore classes which lacked for three and one-half hours.

As the Winter Carnival became a permanent fixture on the carnpus the idea of a king and queen was incorporated. The honor connected with being elected king and queen of the Vinter Carnival has risen to the point where it is just as great as being elected Hamesoning queen.

The duties of the king and queen are to reign over all Winter Carnival festivities. The queen rolls the first ball at the bowling tournament and the king and queen take the first slide down the hill on Saturday afternoon.

#### Yellowjackets Here

Coach Leo DiMarco brings his highriding Superior Yellowjackets here tomorrow night in the feature game of the Winter Carnival. The Falcon must win this game to stay on top of the conference.

Superior is in second place in the conference with a 4-1 record. Their only defeat was administered by Platteville.

The Yellowjackets have the best defensive record of any conference team while the Falcons have the best offensive record and ranks fourth in team defense.

Milt Krznarich and Dom Moselle will start the game at the guards for Superior. Krznarich, a senior, is captain of the team. Moselle was an all-conference guard choice in 1946 and 1947.

Hub Dodge, a senior, and Fred Walker, a freshman, are the probable starting forwards. Dodge is a potent scorer while Walker is a former All-European selection. Gene Omernik, a six foot five inch sophomore, will be at center.
