

### The Falcon Award

The Falcon Award will be awarded to the organization which demonstrates the most spirit, cooperation, and good sportsmanship throughout the week. Missing an event that the group is signed up for automatically disqualifies that group from winning this award. Poor sportsmanship and derogatory remarks will be disqualifying factors.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### -Organization Competition-

There will be an informational meeting on Thursday, January 31, at 5:00 p.m., in the Presidents' Room of the Student Center. All participants are encouraged to attend.

- 1. Any recognized campus organization may participate in any Winter Carnival event and accumulate points toward competition placing.
- 2. All participants must be UW-River Falls students or recognized staff advisers. Greek pledges may compete with their fraternal organizations. An individual may compete with only one organization.
- 3. Applications must be submitted to the Student Programming Office (218 Hagestad Student Center) by Friday, February 1, 4:00 p.m.
- 4. Any violation in rules may result in disqualification of the organization from the competition. The governing body to determine rule infraction or penalty will be the Special Events Committee.
- 5. Profanity, insinuations, or derogatory remarks during any competitive event will result in automatic disqualification of the group for that event.
- 6. The Special Events Committee will not be responsible for any damages or injury occurring during scheduled events.
- 7. A scoreboard will be posted near Brandy's in the Student Center. Results will be posted as available.
- 8. Organizations are expected to participate in events for which they register. Failure to do so will result in a five point deduction from their cumulative score, and the organization will no longer be eligible to win the Falcon Award.
- 9. Hagestad Union Board of Directors and members of the Special Events Committee may not participate in Winter Carnival activities, including royalty competition.
- 10. Two organizations may sponsor a royalty couple jointly, but must enter organization competition separately.
- 11. In each competition five places will be awarded points (as listed below). Overall winners will be announced during the performance of "Mr. Meyers", in Brandy's, Saturday, Feb. 16, at 9:00 p.m.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

### -Royalty Competition-

- 1. King and Queen candidates must be sponsored by a recognized UW-River Falls Student Organization to be eligible for competition.
- King and Queen candidates must be full-time students at UW-River Falls. Candidates must have completed at least one semester at UW-River Falls and have a cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.25 or better.
- 3. Any violation in rules may result in disqualification of the candidates from the competition. The governing body to determine rule infractions or penalties will be the Special Events Committee.
- 4. Profanity, insinuations, or derogatory remarks during any competition event will result in automatic disqualification for that event. The Special Events Committee will be the governing body in determining rule infractions and penalties.
- Applications are due no later than 4:00 p.m., Friday, February 1st, to the Student Programming Office, room 218 Hagestad Student Center.
- 6. Both King and Queen candidates must be present at the Royalty Reception on Tuesday, February 5th at 4:00 p.m., in the Regents Room. Important information will be discussed and photos will be taken at this time.
- Coronation will be Thursday, February 14, at 8:00 p.m. in Brandy's before Acme Vocals. A royal court
  consisting of the three top placing couples will be recognized. All candidates are expected to attend
  coronation.
- After each competition, those couples finishing in the top two places will be announced alphabetically.
   A scoreboard will be posted near Brandy's in the Student Center. Results will be posted as available.

# PINEAPPLE BOWLING (ROYALTY COMPETITION)

## LIMBO CONTEST (ROYALTY COMPETITION)

- 1. A couple will participate as a team.
- 2. The team achieving the lowest height wins. (Both people must clear the pole at each height.)
- 3. No use of aids will be allowed. Examples include roller skates, skateboards, etc.
- 4. Neither the pole nor the floor may be touched by the contestant as he/she passes under the pole.
- 5. The competition will continue until a winning couple is determined.
- 6. Judges decisions are final.

- 1. Each couple will participate in this event.
- 2. Winners are determined by the length of twirling time. The time for each member of a couple will be added together for a "total team time".
- 3. Time will start when the hoop leaves the hands and will stop when the hoop falls below the knees. The hoop must be kept twirling at all times and must be kept around the hips or waist. No hand-help is allowed.

#### MEDALLION HUNT

- 1. Any UW-RF Student is eligible to win the \$50 prize.
- 2. A new clue will be posted each day at 8:00 a.m. at the Information Desk. The clues will also be read over WRFW at approximately noon and 5 p.m. daily.
- 3. The medallion is hidden on or in University owned properties and can be found during regular operating hours. No buildings or special areas will be opened for medallion hunters. Hunters are to honor all signs, special notices, and <u>ALL</u> University, state, and federal laws when in search of the medallion.
- 4. To claim the prize, the medallion must be returned to the Office of Student Programming during regular operating hours: 8:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m. Students must verify by presenting a valid student ID. The prize money will be sent to the student approximately 3 weeks following his/her claim.
- 5. The medallion is a gold plated coin approximately the size of a silver dollar.

#### **ROYALTY VOTING**

- 1. Voting will be held at the designated places, dates, and times.
- 2. All those wishing to vote must present a current UW-RF student ID. A student must be present with their own ID to register a vote.
- 3. Voters may choose up to two different royalty couples. While a student may choose to vote for only one couple, they may not choose the same couple twice.
- 4. Royalty photographs will be posted at the polling site.
- 5. No candidates may actively campaign within 30 feet of the voting site.

# SNOW VOLLEYBALL (ORGANIZATION COMPETITION)

This event will take place on the three outside volleyball courts on campus (behind Crabtree, Hathorn, and between Stratton and Prucha). Bracketing will be posted outside the Office of Student Programming. It is the responsibility of the organization to check the time and location of their team's game.

There must be equal players per team (ie. 4 male and 4 female, with eight being the maximum number). Single gender organizations must have opposite gender volunteers for this event only. Volunteers may not compete in this event with any other organization.

#### General Rules:

- 1. This will be single elimination with 1 game.
- 2. A game is won when a team has scored 15 points and has a 2 point advantage. Play continues until one team has a 2 point advantage.
- 3. Teams shall change courts when one team has reached 8 points.
- 4. Rules will be posted on site.

# Snow Sculpture (ORGANIZATION COMPETITION)

- 1. Each organization will construct a snow sculpture.
- 2. There may not be internal support used in the building process.
- 3. Sculptures will be judged on Tuesday, Feb. 12, at 4 p.m. All sculpting is to be completed by this time.
- 4. Organizations may use only food coloring to decorate their sculptures. (Spray bottles work well.)
- 5. Sculptures will be judged on: creativity, artistic design, overall appearance and adherence to theme.
- 6. Sculptures may not be built in emergency entrances, loading areas or on walkways on the campus or in the community. Any off campus sculptures must be approved by land owners before building begins.
- 7. The snow sculptures event may be canceled due to the lack of snow. This decision will be made by the Winter Carnival Committee by 4 p.m., Monday, Feb. 11. In this situation, "Window Painting" will be substituted. The decision will be posted in the Office of Student Programming, room 218 Hagestad Student Center.
- 8. Each organization is to identify their sculpture with a sign.

### Tuesday, February 12th(continued)

#### **Window Painting**

- 1. This event will be used <u>only if</u> there is not sufficient snow to hold the "Snow Sculpture Competition". A decision will be made by Monday, Feb. 11, at 4 p.m. The decision will be posted in the Office of Student Programming, room 218 Hagestad Student Center.
- 2. At 8 a.m., Tuesday, Feb.12, each organization will be assigned a window in the Student Center carpeted area (east end of building) to complete their art work.
- 3. The HUB Special Events Committee will provide all necessary materials.
- 4. Judging of the artwork will take place at 4 p.m., Tuesday, Feb. 12th.
- 5. All painters must be members of the organization.
- 6. Organizations participating in this event will be required to pay a \$25 deposit, payable when supplies are received. Deposits will be returned once organizations have adequately cleaned their assigned window.
- 7. Organizations will be responsible for all clean up. Windows must be cleaned before Friday, February 15, at 4 p.m.
- 8. The event will be judged on creativity, originality, and adherence to theme.

#### Caribbean Skits

#### (ORGANIZATION COMPETITION)

- 1. Each organization is to present their favorite scene from either the TV show "The Love Boat" or "Fantasy Island".
- 2. Set up and take down of props is to take no longer than one minute each. There is a time limit of five minutes for each production. A one point deduction will be given for every 30 seconds over the time limit.
- 3. Organizations are to supply their own props, music, and supports. The skits will contain at least five organization members.
- 4. This event is judged on stage presence, creativity, and entertainment value.

# TABOO (ORGANIZATION COMPETITION)

This will be a tournament adaptation of the Milton Bradley game of "Taboo".

- 1. Teams will consist of 5 organization members.
- 2. Bracketing will be posted outside the Office of Student Programming prior to the event (starting Mon., Feb. 11) and on site.
- 3. The game is played by team members taking turns as clue givers. They must get their team members to say the "guess word". Clue givers may give words or sentences to help their teammate say the guess word. However, there will be five "taboo" words which cannot be used when giving clues.
- 4. Sound effects, gestures, abbreviations, rhymes, initials, or any part of the guess or "taboo" words may not be used.
- 5. Points are scored by teammates saying the "guess word". Points are awarded to the other team by passing on a word or by getting buzzed for the above violation.
- 6. Each team member will take a turn at being the clue giver. Each clue giver will race against the one minute time.
- 7. The game is over when each team has had the same number of turns. The highest score wins.
- 8. All referee decisions are final.

\*It is highly advised that teams arrive before their scheduled time to review rules and observe the game in play.
